Free jailed Iranian trade unionists

Help free Mansour Osanloo, an ex-bus driver beaten and imprisoned for nothing worse than working for a trade union.

Mansour Osanloo is the head of the Syndicate of Workers of Tehran and Suburbs Bus Company (Sherkat-e Vahed). He and his colleagues have been harassed, beaten up and jailed for belonging to a legal, independent, 17,000 strong union.

In the latest attack on him he was snatched from the street by unidentified thugs and – despite government denials that they were involved – found in Evin prison two days later. He's still there, being held without charge and with his lawyer, doctor and family barred from visiting him.

Meanwhile Mahmoud Salehi of the Saqez Bakery Workers' Association is being held in another Iranian jail, guilty of nothing more than organising a legal trade union.
